

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



This past summer the inaugural IRONMAN 70.3 Ohio was hosted at City of Sandusky in Shores & Islands Ohio. The event marks the start of an annual tradition, as IRONMAN, City of Sandusky, and Shores & Islands Ohio agreed to a three-year deal that will see the event return to the destination in 2023 and 2024. This will be the only IRONMAN event in Ohio during that time frame.

IRONMAN found a home in Shores & Islands Ohio, also known as America's Sports & Family Fun Capital, as the area embodies the excitement of a race weekend felt from the very first-time visitors to becoming a seasoned regular part of the welcoming community. The unforgettable 8+ hour race experience starts with athletes jumping off the Kelleys Island Ferry "Carlee Emily" at the Jackson Street Pier, part of downtown Sandusky, for 1.2-mile swim in Lake Erie.

After a loop along the Sandusky Bay and to the Paper District Marina, the athletes make the transition from water to land and begin cycling through Erie and Sandusky counties, climbing approximately 790 feet over the course of 56 miles across scenic rural county roads. Athletes return to the Paper District Marina after completing the bike course, before beginning the 13.1-mile run through the streets in downtown Sandusky.

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After two loops of the run course, the athletes finish the race on Columbus Avenue in front of the Historic Sandusky State Theatre, with Schade Mylander Plaza framing views of Lake Erie as competitors cross the line. All this on an exciting coastal course while being surrounded by spectators from start to finish!

While race day is the highlight, this is actually has become a weekend long event. IRONKIDS Ohio takes place the Saturday before IRONMAN, where hundreds of athletes under the age of 18 have the opportunity to join in the action with three distances for different age groups. Starting at the Jackson Street Pier, the Toddler Dot Trot is a 30-foot dash for children age 1-3, as well as half-mile and mile races for ages 3-8 and 5-17.

Jackson Street Pier in Sandusky is also the scenic host of the IRONMAN Village that is free and open to the public, housing athlete registration as well as a number of event partners and local vendors. The Official IRONMAN Store was open on selected hours on Friday through Sunday. A variety of downtown restaurants also participated in the I'M Local Program by offering discounts for race participants and volunteers who just have to show their race bibs, medals or credentials to receive exclusive offers.

Tucked away in the rolling hills of Appalachia in downtown Caldwell is a family ice skating rink, a great winter excursion. Just off Interstate 77 at exit 25 and SR78 to SR821, the Village of Caldwell rink is a great activity.

If you are not a great skater, there is plenty of seating for chaperones and for spectators on the picnic tables, swings and benches. Warming stations are also an option. On the synthetic rink, you can use regular hockey skates. If you don't have your own, the rink also has skates available by donation.

The rink was the dream and brainchild of Caldwell Mayor Misty Wells. She wanted to encourage guests to visit her "Hallmark-esque" downtown and set out to secure funding for a family-style rink. It is the only synthetic ice-skating rink within 50 miles of Noble County.


Especially after the routine holiday weight gain, ice skating is a great winter wellness activity for families. Research also shows that this low-impact exercise can be a great workout for the heart. It is also a great balance-building activity for children and adults.

If you are concerned about falls, the rink provides beginners with a balance bar option until you "get your feet under you." But you can also consider helmets, knee pads or shin guards if you want to bring them along.

According to one synthetic ice rink company, ice skating can vary with the intensity of the workout and the person's size, but Harvard Medical School estimates a 155-pound person can burn 210-311 calories in a half-hour of ice skating.

Skating is also a great group activity boosting your social impact and overall mental health with fresh air and fellowship with friends! Great opportunities for daytime or nighttime group photos or shots of friends fallen on the ice.

This unique outdoor rink provides music, fresh air and a unique atmosphere for a great old-fashioned family outing. There were about 60 hikers at the first Winter Hike, which has grown to over 5,400. Hikers have overcome blizzards, sleet storms, and bitter cold to come to the hike, and the only time officials canceled the event was the Blizzard of 1978, and still, 70 hikers showed up.



THE BUCK FIFTY RACE:

Creating a Drug Free America One Relay at a Time

In 2012 Dave Huggins, the heart and soul of the Buck Fifty race, ran his first relay race. He didn't realize at the time how that one event would transform his life and the lives of his community.

Now in its seventh year, The Buck Fifty race consists of teams of 10 runners running three legs of the overnight relay. Starting in Chillicothe, the race winds through stunning state and national parks scenery to raise money and awareness for Drug Free Clubs of America (DFCA).

"I don't think kids want to do drugs. I think they want to go to school and be kids," states Huggins. Across America, the Opioid epidemic has been a systemic problem, but in Ross County, the community, spearheaded by Huggins, is working to change the narrative. In just over six years, they have raised 1.2 million dollars for DFCA. The Buck Fifty race believes in making a difference in kids' lives before they start using drugs and has an enrollment of over 60% of the teen population in the county.

While the Buck Fifty race is a philanthropic event, the rewards go beyond supporting the DFCA. The success of the race hinges on many aspects. Businesses, sponsors, community organizations, and individuals spend countless hours planning for every twist

and turn the race may see throughout

the year. While the event is in the planning stage, runners from various states band together to form teams of 10 and train for the race. But for all of this to work, each individual must remember they are part of a team. Without a team-first mentality, none of this would be possible.

In 2022, 88 teams took part in the race, and 8 were all female teams. Organizers would like to see this number increase in a sport that women dominate. But hurry, the February 1, 2023 deadline is fast approaching!

The race takes place on April 21-22, with 400 volunteers on hand to encourage and guide the runners to the finish line. What starts out as a way to give back to the community quickly becomes a party. The community turns out to support and encourage the runners through each leg of the race doing their part to make this relay a success. But the best part is at the finish line. The kids of DFCA, who are at the heart of the Buck Fifty, are there to personally award the medals

to the runners.

Nothing in life worth attaining is easy. By making a conscious decision to show up and push themselves each day, runners, volunteers, and the kids demonstrate that you can do anything, you put your mind to. This mindset is what makes the Buck

Fifty continue to be such a success.

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

Celebrate Winter at the Medina Ice Festival

From February 17-20, Medina hosts its 29th Annual Ice Carving Festival, which is the largest festival in Northeast Ohio. This must-see event expects over 120 sculptures and will give you a reason to come out and enjoy.

The history of ice sculpting goes back thousands of years as people came to appreciate the gift from

nature. From its humble beginnings as a carving of ice to preserve food, it has since grown into an art form used to entertain, decorate and serve as functional displays.

Skilled artists use simple tools, such as chisels, hair dryers, irons, and chainsaws, to create masterpieces out of frozen water. The ideal temperature for the ice is between 15-25 degrees Fahrenheit, meaning the sculptor must work in extreme conditions, and often a walk-in freezer is used to maintain an even temperature. The Ice Festival is a judged event; awards are given in various categories.

The Medina Competition offers a chance to see these artists at work and appreciate their fine attention to detail.


The carvings are displayed in and around Historic Medina Square and the South Town District and are available round the clock. During the evening hours, color-changing LED lights highlight the sculptures.

These 3-D masterpieces are exquisite in design and craftsmanship. One artist may create a dramatic dragon, and another can depict a sailboat. The ice lends itself to an artist's interpretation. The temperature and surrounding conditions can impact the composition and clarity of the ice. A sculptor may desire a block of ice that is clear or cloudy, depending on the design.

While visiting the Ice Festival, leave some time to visit the quaint shops and local eateries. Main Street Medina boasts over 35 bakeries, restaurants, and snack places. Throughout the year, the town hosts many events and activities for the entire family. The community is warm and welcoming, and once you discover Main Street Medina and all it has to offer, you will want to come back and see what each new season brings to this charming town.


the WinterFest party Saturday evening, featuring a live band.

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TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE

Plan now to Experience it in Sandusky County, Ohio!



Plan now for Ohio's Total Solar Eclipse, April 8, 2024

By now, many people have probably heard the buzz surrounding the Total Solar Eclipse that will take place in parts of Ohio, including Fremont, Ohio located in Sandusky County, on April 8, 2024. People within a 124-mile-wide band in the state of Ohio will experience a total solar eclipse.

Areas in Ohio that are outside the path of totality will experience a partial eclipse. A total solar eclipse is a rare and spectacular event. On average, one happens somewhere on the Earth only once every 1.5 years. Only 21 total solar eclipses have crossed the lower 48 states in the entire existence of the United States. On that day, "totality" as it is referred to, will enter Ohio around 3:00 p.m. in the southwest corner of the state and will exit the northeast corner around 3:10 p.m. During that time, those in the path of the total solar eclipse will be cast into darkness.


Our entire county will be in the area of totality. Sandusky County will experience 3 minutes 38 seconds of darkness. The last time Ohio saw a total solar eclipse was in 1806. Anyone wishing to view another total solar eclipse in Ohio will have to wait until the year 2444!

What does this rare natural phenomenon mean for Sandusky County and Ohio? More that 70% of the country is within a 1-day drive of Ohio. Because we will be in a high demand viewing area, it is estimated that our county will see a population influx of nearly 118,000 additional people. Over 1 million people are expected to descend on our county and its contiguous counties over that weekend. Of course, this means millions of tourism dollars

will pour into our state and region during this time.

Sandusky County and the State of Ohio began planning for this several years ago. The county is diligently working to coordinate entertainment, educational opportunities and lodging options. All plans for the county will be included on the State of Ohio Eclipse website. It will include information on the solar eclipse, an interactive map for searching things to do, areas to view the eclipse and safe ways to view it. After indulging in a delicious drink, a trip to a local eatery is in order. Restaurants like Ale House





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



The Monroe Theatre: SANCE ARENAGING UNFOLDING By Ashley Schumacher

Traveling through many towns across Ohio, individuals see the unmistakable vestiges of early 20th century movie theaters. These structures often evoke images of classic movies, Saturday cowboy matinees and live performances.

Some of these theaters remain alive, while others appear forgotten. However, the historic Monroe Theatre, in Woodsfield, Ohio, is experiencing a robust renaissance after its 45-year closure.

The Monroe Theatre, built by Mena Fliehman, opened its recognizable Art Deco doors in December 1939, as both a movie theater and stage for musicians. Many of these performers are considered pillars of bluegrass and country music, proven by their appearances at the Grand Ole Opry and inductions into the Country Music Hall of Fame. Performers such as Bill Monroe, Tex Ritter, Flatt & Scruggs, and an unknown teenager later known as Patsy Cline and others took to the same stage being used today at the Theatre.

The Monroe Theatre was a frequent stop for these performers on their way to Wheeling, West Virginia's WWVA Jamboree. As times changed, the Monroe Theatre became solely a theater closing in 1977. Since 2019, however, the Theatre's trademark doors are open again, welcoming back audiences.

When the Monroe Arts Council, a 501[c]3, acquired the Monroe Theatre in 2016, it became eligible for state and local grant dollars essential

for the restoration. These and private donations made the following renovations possible.

- December 2019
- Four furnaces were installed; prior to this, patrons brought blankets and the Theatre closed during the winter.
- Summer 2020 -The auditorium ceiling was insulated through a community campaign, Purchase a Roll.

- May 2021 A concession stand / box office was added. A bistro is planned for the future.
- August 2021 Two ADA family restrooms were completed; until this time, no restroom facilities were available.
- Summer 2022 Air conditioning was installed and awaiting electrical upgrades.
- September 2022 Roof replacement, vital masonry work and window replacement begin. This was possible through a 2020 Community Development Block Grant totaling \$280,000.
- A balcony addition is slated for the Theatre's future made possible through an Appalachian Regional Commission grant in the amount of \$345,000.

Other work to be completed includes replacement of the

ceiling, a sprinkler system and seating.

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

Along with Thanksgiving, Christmas, Hanukkah, Kwanza, and the dawn of a New Year, Stark County residents will have another reason to celebrate this holiday season: the Stark Area Regional Transit Authority's (SARTA) 25th Anniversary year beginning on December 3.

Like Thanksgiving and Christmas, SARTA's upcoming birthday provides an opportunity for us to reflect on the past and take a nostalgic trip down memory lane—or, in SARTA's case, the millions of miles of lanes, roads, avenues, streets and highways our vehicles have traveled on since our first rider climbed aboard on the chilly Monday morning that marked the beginning of the system's quarter-century-long journey.

To be honest, no one was quite sure if the public would use the new countywide transit service, but one vear and 1.1 million rides later, it was clear that SARTA was on the road to success. The overwhelmingly positive response fueled growth that continues to this day. Service to outlying areas of Stark County, Akron, and Cleveland via the longest fixed route operated by a transit system in the U.S., was added, hours of operation increased from 13 to 21, and the Belden Village, Cornerstone, Alliance, and Massillon transit centers were opened. As a result, ridership hit an all-time high of 2.5 million in 2014 and demand for the system's 30 fixed routes, Proline ADA, and Success Express service remains strong today.

Along with adding and enhancing service to meet the needs of the community, SARTA has developed and deployed cutting-edge transit technology, including EZfare, SMART Card Tap-Card fare payment, and SARTA PinPoint by MyStop, that make it easier and more convenient than ever for riders to reach thousands of destinations across Stark County.

SARTA's use of technology goes beyond how people ride to include what they ride in. Under CEO Kirt Conrad, who joined the system in 2009, SARTA has become a national and international leader in the use of low and zero emission vehicles and today operates the third largest fleet of hydrogen fuel cell powered (HFC) buses in the Western Hemisphere.



The system will continue to acquire and operate full size and 12-passenger HFC vehicles, will open our hydrogen fueling stations to the public, and play a key role in the campaign to secure a large federal grant that will fund the development of a hydrogen hub in the region.


The system is also undertaking an impressive capital campaign that includes the construction of a new Massillon Transit Center and expansion of the Gateway headquarters facility. And as always,

Stop by the Grape Discovery Center in Westfield, the hometown of Welch's, to learn about the 150-year history of grape-growing in the region and sample local wine, grape juice and shop for other grape inspired artisanal products.

Enjoy a craft beverage from one of the breweries and distilleries located throughout the region including Southern Tier Brewing Company, one of the largest craft brewers in the United States. Try Ellicottville Brewing Company signature beers at their Fredonia location, not far from Lake Erie and local wineries. Fuel up for a day

of adventures with a coffee and breakfast from a local coffee shop or café. Sit down for a delicious meal at one of the many local restaurants open yearround. Whether you are craving hearty, comfort food, classic bar food or an upscale dining experience, you will find it all in the Chautauqua-Lake Erie Region.

Nothing warms the heart like laughter. The intuitive technology powering the National Comedy Center in Lucille Ball's hometown, Jamestown, NY, takes guests on a journey through comedy's history.
