Festival of Lights Returns to Oglebay for Another Exciting Season

For 37 years, Oglebay's Festival of Lights has become an annual tradition for many families. Each year thousands flock to Oglebay for their Festival of Lights event. Parents and grandparents alike bring their families from near and far to share in their heartwarming memories filled with nostalgia. As you drive through the stunning historic grounds of Oglebay Park in West Virginia you will be in awe of the millions of twinkling lights.

"We have over 90 displays that span across six miles of roadway. We are preparing now for the 2022-23 season. It looks to be a really magical experience," stated Bob Peckenpaugh, President & CEO of Wheeling Park Commission.

When you enter Oglebay's "The Hilltop," your lifetime of memories begins as you are greeted by a 70-foot Welcome Tree featuring thousands of lights that combine color, music, light, and animation. It rises seven stories into the stunning night sky allowing for an amazing photo opportunity. Once you have finished admiring the Welcome Tree, roll down the windows and allow all your senses to take in every moment of over 90 larger-than-life light displays.

The six-mile drive includes an array of sparkling tunnel lights as the music fills the park and filters into your vehicle. Watch as displays come to life through sound, motion, and lights that shine from bright to faint and so much more. Children will be wide-eyed and cheering as they see Cinderella in her carriage, dinosaurs roaring, and clowns juggling, to name a few. The fun is not just for the kids, but for everyone who is young at heart!

"Oglebay's Festival of Lights is a holiday tradition that I look forward to every year," said Christy Bennett, a visitor to the event. "My dad had a heart attack almost nine years ago and the lights bring joy and smiles to my family's faces. We have been attending the festival since 2015 and my favorite part is seeing which new light displays are on the map every year. I look forward to enjoying time with my family and bringing in the Christmas season with music, lights, and fun."




In the evening watch the mansion come to life through choreographed holiday hits and animated lights.

Oglebay's Festival of Lights is more than just a drive-through of animated lights and music. It is about families and friends coming together to share in the joy of the holiday season, creating memories, starting traditions, keeping traditions, and sharing laughter.

SARTA Adopts "Tap and Go" ELECTRONIC PAYMENT SYSTEM

The Stark Area Regional Transit Authority (SARTA), long a national leader in the development and deployment of innovative transportation technology, recently rolled out a new paperless "tap and go" electronic payment system that will make traveling to the thousands of destinations the system serves easier and more convenient than ever before.

Free "SCORE Cards" are at the heart of the exciting new way to purchase passes and tickets for SARTA's fixed routes, ProLine on-demand ADA service, the Success Express, and student discount program. SCORE Cards were made available to the public in July. "Touch Down Cards," a non-reloadable, limited use card will be added to the paperless lineup in the near future. Both may be obtained at the system's transit centers or ordered online at sartaonline.com/tapcard.

According to SARTA CEO Kirt Conrad, the new cards, which utilize radio frequency identification (RFID) technology, will significantly improve and enhance the passenger experience and enable the system to go completely paperless beginning January 1, 2023.

"Our plastic SCORE Cards are reloadable and will score lots of points with frequent riders," Conrad said. "Once a customer creates an account online or at one of our transit centers and loads or reloads their card with fares or stored cash value it literally becomes their ticket to ride SARTA."

"Passengers won't have to purchase and keep track of paper passes, tickets, or transfers, fumble for them in their pocket, wallet, or purse when they board our vehicles, or hand them to their driver," Conrad continued. "With a SCORE Card they can tap our new fare RFID fare boxes, say 'hi' to their driver, take their seat, sit back, relax, and enjoy their trip. The new system really makes riding easier than ever."

"While the SCORE Card is the perfect choice for people who ride a lot, we created the Touchdown Card to ensure that occasional passengers and visitors to the area can experience all the advantages of the tap and go system," said Conrad. "For example, people who visit Canton for the Pro Football Hall of Fame ceremonies will be able to purchase a Touchdown Card and use SARTA to travel to and from the Hall during their stay. Like the SCORE Card it's a real winner."

Conrad also noted that the new electronic payment system will reduce the environmental impact associated with the making, printing, and disposing of paper tickets and passes. "We're proud of the fact that SCORE, like our award winning zero-emission hydrogen fuel cell bus program, will advance SARTA's commitment to sustainability."

In addition to the SCORE and Touch Down cards, riders will still be able to use the free EZfare mobile app and exact change to purchase tickets and passes.





JACK PINE STUDIO KNOWN FOR GLASS BLOWN ART AROUND THE COUNTRY

Artist Jack Pine is a renowned glass blower known for his glass pumpkins and other exquisite pieces of finely crafted art over the past three decades. With the holidays around the corner, this glass art makes for a perfect one-of-kind holiday gift for your loved one.

Pine is inherently drawn to nature and has always been inspired by organic form. His work is motivated by his surroundings to influence the use of highly saturated colors and precious metals incorporated with molten glass. He was also inspired by both of his parents as they were artists themselves. His mother was a skilled painter and sculptor, and his father pursued his own inventions.

“I grew up on a small Southern Ohio farm just outside Circleville. Living here had a profound influence on my artwork. I absolutely love all the beautiful colors, textures, and shapes

found in nature around me,” stated Pine, Owner/Artist of Jack Pine Studios. “Circleville has the largest pumpkin festival in the country, so it was almost destiny for me as a glass artist to make glass pumpkins. I’ve been striving to make the best glass pumpkins for over 30 years.”

Pine received a scholarship to study glass at Columbus College of Art & Design allowing him the opportunity to follow his passion for art. After finishing college, he headed west and worked in the famous glass houses of Seattle, Washington. He then moved to the stunning mountains of Colorado and opened his own glass studio. Here is where the famous blown glass pumpkin was created. He also began traveling around the country, doing shows. Art enthusiasts can find his work in stores like museum gift shops across the country.

After 15 years, he returned to his hometown and built a new glass studio in the beautiful heart of Hockings Hills, Ohio. Jack Pine Studio opened in December, 2017 and is about a mile from the Rock House, one of Ohio’s famous destinations. The studio also features artwork from talented artists from across the country. You could stumble across metal wall art and table art, glass blown pieces using different techniques leaving each piece to stand on its own merit and art pieces that bring both nature and humanity together as one. The studio offers a variety of stylistic art pieces allowing visitors to purchase a beautiful addition to their home.

When you step into Jack Pine Studio, you are mesmerized by the array of art full of colors, shapes, and sizes. Glass hummingbird feeders, hearts, pumpkins, ornaments, and vases are just a few of the items one will find in the glass gallery. Each piece is unique in style.

During studio hours, you can watch the magic as glassblowers work to transform molten glass into delicate new pieces of art. Artists are available to answer any questions you may have about the process.

Gather your family and friends and schedule a Glass Blowing Workshop at the studio to create your own unique piece of artwork. In each workshop, you will select bits of colored glass and then partner with a glass artist to create a work of art. You will dip a blowpipe with hot glass into your color and shape the glass with advanced tools. Depending on your class, you will blow out a pumpkin or create a colorful paperweight. Your piece of art will be ready for pick-up within two days, or you may have it shipped. Each workshop lasts around 90 minutes and can accommodate up to six people. Private Sessions are also available.

The process involves creating layers of glass using raw materials with synthesized metals and shapes the glass while molten using critical glass-blowing tools. Pine utilizes the famous “Tiffany style” techniques, which create a mother of pearl, iridized, and lustrous appearance with silver and gold permeated throughout the work.

While in a molten state, the glass flows in a liquid form requiring Pine’s undivided attention and focus. When cooled, the glass becomes an immovable yet fragile material that is admired all over the world.

“I use intense and primitive methods to create one-of-a-kind glass pieces that are mesmerizing to see during the dance of glass blowing,” stated Pine. “After the piece has cooled, it displays craftsmanship and captures light with iridescence and demanding beauty.”




Unique gifts and experiences abound in Athens. In the few blocks that comprise the Uptown area, you can find everything from novel takes on hand-made goods like

& Nutcrackers

Looking for a holiday destination with family-centered displays, activities, and events? Look no further than Steubenville in eastern Ohio which has become a mecca for Christmas lovers.

It began eight years ago with the creation of the Steubenville Nutcracker Village. Starting with just 35 life-sized original nutcrackers depicting characters from literature, art, music, and entertainment, the collection has grown to 200 on display 24/7 throughout the historic business district on 4th Street in downtown Steubenville from November 22, 2022 through January 7, 2023.

All the nutcrackers are designed and produced locally by the creative elves at Nelson's of Steubenville. From the characters of the *Wizard of Oz* to the members of the Rat Pack and a huge variety of figures from history and the professions, the nutcrackers provide excellent opportunities for making family memories and taking selfies. See www.steubenvillanutcrackervillage.com.

Additional attractions have developed alongside the Nutcracker Village including a Holiday Market and Christmas at the Fort. Set up under a canopy of lights and music in Fort Steuben Park, the Market offers gifts, décor, and foods of the season. Choirs and singers gather around the 32' Christmas Tree while St. Nicholas strolls among the visitors. New this year will be a "forest of animated trees" in Fort Steuben Park.

The 18th century Fort Steuben is open for tours at a nominal fee. Inside the Visitor Center, a model train village is on display and the Fort Gift Shop is stocked with holiday items as well as books, toys, and souvenirs. Check oldfortsteuben.com for more information.

The downtown streets are decorated with 25 live Christmas trees with a tree decorating competition for local non-profits that viewers can vote for. Students from the local schools have decorated store fronts to enhance the holiday spirit.

The Public Library of Steubenville & Jefferson County offers a Nutcracker Storywalk among the trees and nutcrackers on 4th Street, so visitors can search for pages and enjoy a seasonal classic while they walk. The Children's Corner on 4th & Market Streets will be open on weekends with free crafts, games, performances, and photos with Father Christmas.

No holiday event is complete without a parade and the Steubenville Sights and Sounds of Christmas Parade will process down 4th Street at noon on December 3 with bands, dancers, and floats to celebrate the season.



After a lapse of two years, the original musical production *Wooden Heart Follies* is returning this season. Created by veteran community theater actors, directors, and playwrights John and Von Holmes, the play brings to life nine nutcrackers, using the music of Tchaikovsky's *Nutcracker Suite* with comic lyrics added.

The story begins once upon a time in a magical land called Steubenville, where the mad scientist nutcracker falls in love with his human designer and turns the Nutcracker Village upside down. The Ohio History Connection, Ohio’s nominating authority to the National Register of Historic Places

program, approved The Caldwell Downtown Square as an historic district. The original town plat is still evident through the street grid arranged around a central public square with the Noble County courthouse serving as the focal point and 61 late-nineteenth to mid-twentieth century historic resources that contribute to the significance and integrity of the district where there is free parking.

Also on the Registry is the unique Noble County Jail & Sheriff’s Office Museum. This experience will take you back to when nearly 60% of Ohio’s counties had a combined jail and sheriff’s office/residence. Be sure to get your Noble County historic site trading cards when you stop.

Caldwell is also located along one of the state’s scenic byways, the Appalachian Byway of Ohio. This multi-county byway follows State Route 78 from The Ohio River Scenic Byway (SR7) to Nelsonville, Ohio, with a leg-up to the famed Columbus Zoo-operated The Wilds. The 9,000-plus-acre park provides kids with an immersive safari experience.

It is just about 23 miles north of Marietta or 80 miles south from Canton and 100 miles from Akron, making Caldwell a great weekend road trip. Local eatery options include family restaurants like Lori’s and Patty’s Place or Wing’s Etc., and local pizzerias such as Wally’s or Creno’s.

Under the nighttime skies, family ice skating is available by donation. Whether you’re new or a seasoned skater,



Visit Historic Roscoe Village at Christmas

Longing for a more relaxing version of the holidays this year? Look no further than Historic Roscoe Village, located in Coshocton, Ohio.

Roscoe Village is a canal-era neighborhood filled with charming historic buildings, many of which were built in the 1830s. These buildings offer a glimpse into the past, but are now home to modern shops, restaurants and pubs. Imagine strolling the historic street with a bit of snow in the air, evergreens and lit trees along the walks, candles in the windows, a welcoming light to all who come.

The village's small businesses are filled with special gifts, many made locally. Restaurants include Texas-style barbeque, American-fare steaks and burgers, gourmet hotdogs and made-to-order subs and salads. There's even a shop filled with candy! There's no hustle and bustle in Historic Roscoe Village, just a charming village waiting for you to explore.

If history piques your interest, be sure to add the Living History Tour to your visit. Tours are self-guided and allow guests to visit exhibits on their own, at their own pace, no tour guide necessary. Guests will find video kiosks in each living history building and costumed interpreters in some. The tour begins at the Roscoe Village Visitor Center and includes a short film about what life was like on the canals in the early 1800's. Exhibits include The Schoolhouse, Doctor's House and Mrs. Johnson's Kitchen, Doctor Johnson's Office, The Print Shop and The Broom Squire. The Blacksmith Shop and Antique Toy exhibits are open most weekends.

The first two Saturdays in December are Candlelighting Days. "The first Christmas Candlelighting Ceremony took place in 1968," said Roscoe Village Director Casey Brown, "and has been a yearly tradition ever since." Families can enjoy a day of shopping and special activities that may include carolers, roasted chestnuts, visits with Santa, and crafts followed by the Christmas Candlelighting Ceremony, which begins at 6 pm in the center of the village. Gather at the base of the village's giant Christmas tree with friends old and new to remember times past, hear stories, and see the 30-foot tree be lighted.

The passing of the candlelight from one person to another is magical. As the light brightens the darkness, so does the sound of Silent Night, which is sung throughout the crowd. "The ceremony marks the beginning of the holidays for many families," says Brown. Following the ceremony, guests are invited to share hot apple cider and cookies prepared by the village's shop owners.

"Our Holiday Lantern Tour is truly special," says Brown, "and is also an annual tradition for many." Offered only two evenings each year, the tour takes place following the Candlelighting Ceremony. Dates for the Lantern Tour are

December 3 and 10, 2022. Costumed Interpreters lead guests through the village's Living History exhibits, sharing stories of the holiday traditions that were popular during the 1800's. "The tour always sells out," says Brown, "so it's important to make your reservations early at RoscoeVillage.com."

Other events round out the holiday season in Coshocton, making it easy for guests to stay for the weekend. Saturday, December 3 is a special shopping day throughout Coshocton, featuring the Shops of Roscoe Village and those in the Historic Downtown District. The Jingle Bell Shop Hop offers a limited number of tickets for a day of shopping, with free gifts at each participating shop. With over thirty locally owned shops in Historic Roscoe Village and Coshocton's Downtown Historic District, there

is something for everyone, even your furry friends!


