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








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
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

Canaan Valley Resort State Park in the Allegheny Mountains of Davis, West Virginia, offers the usual outdoor snow skiing, snowboarding, snow tubing and ice skating, but they also offer numerous indoor activities so everyone in the family has fun.

Potter and Tioga Counties in northern Pennsylvania have over 450 miles of groomed snowmobile trails and Ski Sawmill Family Resort has a tubing slide with a 70-foot drop for a breathtaking adventure. Most facilities offer rental equipment for outdoor fun.

Swiss Heritage Winery pairs perfectly with cheese. And it's no surprise when you realize the winery was a natural progression for Broad Run Cheesehouse to expand into the wine business. After seven decades of operating a cheesehouse, Hans and Nancy Schindler

opened Swiss Heritage Winery in 2002 as part of Broad Run Corner—at the gateway to Amish Country. Today, second and third-generation winemakers, Chad and Carson Schindler, oversee the wine production, producing 20-plus wines, ranging from red, white, and blush to sweet fruit.



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

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Stem of Stein? Coshocton Will Fill Your Glass

The Three Rivers Wine Trail in Coshocton County, Ohio, is a great place to visit for a day trip or a weekend getaway. The Appalachian Foothills of Coshocton County serves as the backdrop for this eclectic trail of eight unique locations serving carefully crafted wines and beer. No matter the season, the scenery is beautiful and the winemakers and brewers are onsite and ready to greet guests with a friendly smile. The trail is family friendly, and many locations welcome leashed pets on their outdoor patios.

The trail is self-driven, giving tasters the opportunity to relax at each venue. Free Three Rivers Wine Trail Passports are available along the way and, when complete, may be redeemed at the Coshocton Visitors Bureau for an exclusive Three Rivers Wine Trail gift. No purchase is required, but all eight locations must stamp or sign the passport to receive the gift. The trail's locations are easily accessible from I-77 and OH-36, and are less than a two-hour drive from Columbus, Cleveland and Pittsburgh.

Several packages are available throughout the year for a perfect getaway. They include the *Three Rivers Wine Trail Package* and the *Raven's Glenn Wine Tasting Package*.

Beginning in March, 2024, Sip & Stay Thursday returns. Let Cork and Tap Excursions do the driving while enjoying the trail. Included is a double occupancy room at Coshocton Village Inn and Suites with full breakfast, along with transportation, visits and vouchers to four selected locations, and a dinner voucher. This package is only available on Thursdays from March through October, 2024, and sells out quickly. Reservations can be extended at a special rate for those who want to make it a multi-day trip to explore the other Three Rivers Wine Trail locations or other popular Coshocton attractions, such as Historic Roscoe Village and the Historic Downtown District shops and restaurants.

Reservations for *Sip & Stay Thursday* or other packages may be made by calling Coshocton Village Inn and Suites at 740-622-9455.

Hours of operation for Three Rivers Wine Trail locations can vary, so check the Three Rivers Wine Trail Ohio Facebook and Instagram pages for the most up-to-date information. An online map and more details may be found at Three Rivers Wine Trail Ohio.com.

Wineries on the trail offer a variety of experiences; each is independently owned and operated so hours and programming will vary.

Baltic Mill Winery is housed in a converted century-old flour mill. Wine and small plates are served in this cozy and quiet setting, with acoustic music on Saturdays starting with their annual Valentine's Dinner on February 17.

Killing Tree Winery is surrounded by area farms and forests and is the perfect place to relax. They make a wide variety of wines and slushies and have a full-service kitchen that boasts wagyu beef burgers, wood fired pizza and shareables. Live entertainment and craft-and-sip workshops occur throughout the year.

Rainbow Hills Winery, Brewery, and Pizzeria serves delicious pizza and subs along with beer and wine made on site. The stone fireplace in the tasting room is so inviting!

Raven's Glenn Winery & Restaurant serves Mulled Wine and Boozy Hot Chocolate during the cold winter months. Guests can enjoy a fireside meal in the dining room, which overlooks the Tuscarawas River.

Stone Crest Vineyard features award-winning wines in a picturesque setting. The cozy tasting room is the perfect spot to sample a selection of traditional and fruit wines made onsite. Guests can enjoy tastings or buy wine by the bottle. Special dinners and events are held throughout the year.











Wooly Pig Farm Brewery features a welcoming tap room, outdoor covered patio with wood stoves and an outdoor fire pit. Bavarian-style beers are brewed onsite and never disappoint. Limited edition beers are released throughout the year, including the winter favorite Maple Sap Cream Ale.

Yellow Butterfly Winery is housed in an expertly-restored 125-year-old barn that overlooks one of the area's most beautiful valleys. Sip and enjoy the view, which may include the herd of Alpaca that live there.

YOLO Winery is another regional favorite, but is closed January through March, so make plans to visit them come Spring, when guests enjoy live music, food trucks and slushies each weekend.

A father-and-son duo has transformed this space into a modern distillery, reviving Wayne County's Rye Whisky tradition and crafting quality spirits.

A visit to Lincoln Way Vineyards reveals a unique winter charm, creating wines that capture the essence of the season. With every sip and burst of laughter, the motto "Find Your Wine Time" comes to life, infusing the air with a spirited winter vibe.

Amongst the rolling hills, Troutman Vineyards & Winery welcomes guests to find solace in the tranquility of winter. The combination of crisp air and exquisite wines creates a sensory symphony enhanced by the warmth of the fireplace.

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








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THE SUMMIT BREW PATH

The fun is not over when you complete your passport. Mail in your completion form to the Akron/Summit Convention & Visitors Bureau to be invited to our Brew Path Bash. The deadline to finish the Path is November 27, 2024, and all entry forms from the passport must be postmarked no later than December 6, 2024.

The Brew Path Bash showcases all your favorite stops along the Path. With games, live music, and food this event will have you brewing with excitement.






Completing all stops on the passport means you are eligible for a \$1,000 prize. If you can't make it to all the stops, don't worry. You are still eligible for a \$250 prize as long as you have all but four locations stamped. 

Now that the weather is cooler there's no better time to explore some of the wonderful wineries, breweries and distilleries Clermont County has to offer.

Outside of downtown Cincinnati is Mt. Carmel Brewing Company, the first micro-brewery in the city. From humble beginnings to a 30-barrel brewhouse Mt. Carmel continues to lead and innovate the craft brewing frontlines and since 2020 Mt. Carmel has been voted the "Best of the East." Hop on over if you love a hoppy brew; their current tap list features IPAs, Pale Ales, Pilsners, and more with IBUs in the 30s or higher. Cheer on the Bearcats on Saturdays while wearing your Mt. Carmel gear and receive a dollar off brews.

In Milford you don't have to travel far to hit up two fun and delicious hallmarks of Clermont's beverage scene. Just a crosswalk away from each other are Cincinnati Distilling and Little Miami Brewing Company. Cincinnati Distilling considers themselves "delightfully unpredictable" in their craft, following traditional distilling processes but with a twist. Their High Rye Bourbon marries together two favorite whiskey styles creating a balance between spice, heat, and caramel sweetness. Be on the lookout for their Cask Edition Bourbons; after the 2-year aging process these

bourbons are left to age in varying barrels that once contained either hot sauce, beer, or wines imparting the bourbon with those signature flavors.

After your tastings at the distillery, cross Mill Street and enjoy gorgeous views of the Little Miami River at its namesake brewery. Their family friendly taproom is the perfect spot to cheer



on the Bengals while sitting by their firepit and sipping on some of their delicious creations like their Darth Cookie brown ale or maybe their Endless Summer sour.

A little farther from Cincinnati, tucked along the Ohio River Valley, is a winery that truly sings. Harmony Hill is a crowd favorite winery in Clermont County. Featuring one of ten wine caves in the country this winery strives to harmonize itself

with its beautiful surroundings. The acreage features plentiful vineyards and a nationally registered wildlife habitat for guests to wander through as they sip on some cleverly named wines like their 2018 "Concerto" or their 2021 "Nocturn." Harmony Hill is also a part of Clermont's tail trail so bring the pups with you when your visit.

Regardless of your beverage of choice, Clermont County has the perfect spot for you.





Beyond Structures, Rooted in People and Memories

Noble County is a testament to history, resilience, and progress in the heart of Ohio. As the Noble County Historical Society celebrates its 60th anniversary this year, there's an air of reflection, echoing stories of yesteryears brought to life by unveiling new historical markers.

The Old Jail Museum is at the forefront, located at Caldwell's town square. Dating back to 1882, this Victorian brick and sandstone structure paints a picture of an era when the jailer and the incarcerated lived together. Operating as a jail until 1998, today it offers a glimpse into the county's law enforcement history. Beside the Old Jail, the Noble County Courthouse, built in 1934, commands attention. It boasts murals by George K. Marquis, each capturing moments emphasizing the county's dedication to

cherishing its heritage.

Yet, beyond these landmarks, Belle Valley is a reminder of Noble County's diverse heritage. Overlooking Main Street is the Exaltation of the Holy Cross Church, an embodiment of hope and faith for Eastern European immigrants from Ukraine, Latvia, and Slovenia in the early 20th century. Its architectural highlights include a dome inspired by the Carpathian

Mountains and a unique Orthodox cross, epitomizing Eastern Orthodox Christianity's spirit.

The church's cornerstone, inscribed in Slovak and Russian, along with the nearby cemetery, act as silent chronicles of the Eastern European immigrants who made Belle Valley their home in 1875. Their search for freedom and opportunity is etched in every stone, every epitaph.

The Ohio Historical Markers program, led by the Ohio History Connection's Community Engagement Department, is pivotal in these preservation efforts. Since the 1950s, they have introduced 1,750 markers, encapsulating Ohio's diverse history. And as the state archives, the Ohio History Connection safeguards records that piece together Ohio's rich past.


As we approach the 60th anniversary of the Noble County Historical Society, their mission remains clear: to immerse, educate, and inspire by safeguarding local history. But Noble County's heritage isn't solely about physical landmarks; it's about its people. From those who upheld the law to immigrants seeking a fresh start, as we honor the past, we acknowledge every story, every memory, and every echo from those who walked before us and helped to shape Noble County's history and future.

Looking to explore new wineries and craft breweries? Plan a weekend in the Youngstown area and you might discover some new favorite varietals and craft beers. Five beautiful wineries with delicious wine and food options are waiting to be discovered. When the warmer months arrive, several offer scenic outdoor spaces with water views. Five craft breweries offer fun atmospheres with a number of rotating craft beers on tap.

Mastropietro Winery features a Tuscan-style tasting room featuring their 10 wines, 3 of which are estategrown. Live music happens most weekends. Halliday's Winery sits on the banks of Lake Milton. They even have docks nearby where you can dock your boat and easily walk to the winery to enjoy their wines, food and beautiful sunsets.

Drive through the vineyards as you approach The Vineyards at Pine Lake and head to the tasting room to enjoy award winning wine and delicious food prepared by their onsite chef. L'uva Bella Winery is a California-style winery featuring a wine tasting bar, private rooms, a lounge and lovely handcrafted stone patio. Their Bistro features a full menu and offers a wood-fired pizza oven imported from Italy.

New in downtown Youngstown is DOPE Cider House & Winery. Offering handcrafted hard cider, seltzer and wine. This facility is part of the Penguin City Brewing complex. Penguin City has completely renovated an old industrial steel warehouse into a 10,000 s.f. taproom and a 10,000 s.f. 20BBL brewhouse. They frequently host special events and have music and food trucks on hand.

Other craft breweries include Paladin Brewing with 20 high-quality brews on tap, and Noble Creature Wild Ales & Lagers located in a former church with 14 rotating beers on tap. 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

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Clearing the Air for **Future Generations**

Along with being home to Stark Area Regional Transit Authority (SARTA), that has been providing safe, affordable, convenient public transit service for 25 years, the wealth of outdoor activities available to residents year-round helps make Stark County one of the best locations to live, work, and raise a family. The fact is whatever you like to do, hike, bike, run, canoe, kayak, swim, bird watch, golf, skate, ski, or simply stop and smell the roses, you can do it here.

In addition to enjoying all that the great outdoors has to offer, there is something else you can do here thanks to SARTA's enthusiastic embrace of, and investment in, alternative energy and sustainability: breathe easier. That's because the system's full throttle drive to replace its smoke-belching diesel buses with low or zero-emission vehicles powered by compressed natural gas (CNG), batteries, and, most especially, hydrogen fuel cells (HFC) has removed thousands of tons of harmful pollutants from the air above Stark County and Northeast Ohio since it began more than ten years ago.

While that in and of itself was a remarkable achievement, SARTA CEO Kirt Conrad wasn't satisfied. After assembling and operating one of the largest fleets of HFC-powered transit vehicles in the Western Hemisphere,

he was convinced that hydrogen, Earth's most abundant element, could and should play an essential role in helping a wide array of industries reduce harmful emissions, increase energy efficiency, and meet their sustainability goals.

Using SARTA's successful experience as a hook, Conrad began traveling the nation and the world touting the benefits of HFCs. For years, his was a relatively lonely voice drowned out by advocates for the other technologies that were dominating the zero-emission conversation. That changed radically in February of 2022 when the Biden Administration announced that \$8 billion in funding for the development of four "clean hydrogen hubs" was included in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (ILJA).

"I felt both vindicated and excited when I learned about the CHH funding," Conrad said. "For the first time the federal government was acknowledging that I had been right all along: hydrogen would be a vital component of the nation's long-term energy strategy. I immediately began working to ensure that Ohio and Stark

County could reap the economic and environmental benefits of the nation's massive investment in H2 technology."

That work included forming the Ohio Clean Hydrogen Hub Alliance (OH2), the coalition of more than 100 companies, interest groups, universities, and community leaders that led the effort to convince the Department of Energy (DOE) to locate a hub in the state. Eventually, OH2 joined the Appalachian Regional Hydrogen Hub (ARCH2), the multi-state entity that competed for and secured funding from the DOE. You can read more about OH2 and ARCH2 at oh2hub.info.

"The CHH concept will greatly magnify the environmental benefits SARTA's HFC fleet has already generated and clear the air for generations to come," said Conrad. "Just thinking of the future makes me want to go for a run." Hike, snowshoe, or cross country ski in the sparkling snow, warm up near a campfire or hot tub, and enjoy making memories that will last a lifetime!



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
