Located on State Route 68, between Xenia and Yellow Springs, in Oldtown, the park will feature a cultural interpretive center focused on Ohio's Native Peoples, their history in their Ohio homeland, and their lives today.

The 12,000 square foot interpretive center will be a three-story structure, designed to pay tribute to the Shawnee longhouse, the traditional dwelling of the Shawnee people. A living stream will be the signature display on the main floor. Also on this entry level is a theater, exhibits, welcome desk, gift area, and restrooms.

The second floor will feature displays documenting a historical timeline of the Shawnee People in Ohio prior to European settlement to current day. The timeline is punctuated with interesting stories about people of historical importance, bringing history to life in a way that is relatable and memorable.

The lower level of the building will be dedicated to temporary exhibits about the history, culture, art, and modern-day Shawnee Tribe.





## TO DO ON A SHORES E ISLANDS OHÍO BEACH DAY – and the Best Beaches for Each

We all have experienced your typical beach day - lounge by the shore, toes in the sand, kids build sand castles, splash in the water to cool off, and have an allaround enjoyable and relaxing day by the lake. But there are so many different and fun ways to enjoy our beaches. What else can you do at a **Shores & Islands Ohio** beach? Here we break down some other beach options and where you can enjoy the fun.

Fun and Games - While building sandcastles can be a blast, a bit of friendly competition can add a spark of fun to your day. At Nickle Plate Beach in Huron there are sand volleyball courts, permanent corn hole boards, and pingpong tables (rent bean bags and paddles from the Paddle Shack or bring your own). Paddle Shack also rents active group games such as Spikeball, Kan-Jam, Ladder Golf, Giant Yard Pong, beach darts, sports balls, and more. At Cedar Point Beach, from July 19 to August 18, 2024 enjoy nightly activities as part of Boardwalk Nights. When the sun goes down, the Cedar Point Beach and The Boardwalk area of the park electrify with



larger-than-life entertainment, over-thetop food and drink, games for the entire family, music and dancing, lights and sounds that inspire the best summertime dance moves, and more.

Reel in the Big One - Or, tell tall tales about "the one that got away." There are several local beach areas where fishing from shore is encouraged and many with dedicated fishing piers. So, grab some bait and cast off. Beaches with fishing piers include Catawba Island State Park, Kelleys Island State Park, Mazurik Access, South Bass Island State Park, Lions Park, and Nokomis Park. Visitors can even borrow fishing poles and gear from the Ritter Library in Vermilion and then head to Main Street Beach to try their hand at making a big catch.

Hunt for Treasure - Lake Erie's greatest treasure, besides yellow perch and walleye, is beach glass. Sometimes known as sea glass, beach glass hunters especially enjoy hitting the beach in search of rare, weathered glass washed ashore by the lake current. Treasure-

seekers often hit these beaches after a storm or particularly

windy day. In addition to glass, hunters look out for marbles, pottery pieces, shells, and lucky stones (the ear bone of the freshwater drum, or sheephead fish). Beaches known as hot spots for glass hunting include Magee Marsh, Scheeff East Point, and North Pond State Nature Preserve.

Take a Hike - Many beaches are in state parks or nature areas which feature miles of hiking trails. Or, you can take a nice gentle walk on a paved path or boardwalk nearby or leading to the beach. East Harbor State Park offers plenty of hiking and biking trails throughout its expansive park, many adjacent to the beach. Sherod Park and Lakeside Beach also offer paved walking trails near the beach. Sometimes, the reward of a good hike can be the views. If you want a nice walk with a payoff of a beautiful, secluded (non-swimming) beach area, consider Sheldon Marsh or North Pond.

Kiddie Paradise - What is more awesome for a kiddo then an amazing playground to climb and play on, accompanied by miles of sand box for digging and building? Many of the area's beaches also feature play equipment or adjacent parks which can keep little ones entertained for hours. Beaches with playgrounds/parks include Lake Front Park, Bettinger Park/Lakeside Beach, Nickel Plate Beach, Port Clinton City Beach (across from Lakeview Park), and Sherod Park.

Splash with Fido - A number of beaches offer pet-friendly areas or allow dogs on a leash. If you've got a pupper who loves frolicking in the waves, take that furry babe to East Harbor State Park, Wakefield MetroPark (adjacent to Main Street Beach), Kelleys Island State Park, Lake Front Park, or Port Clinton City Beach. Don't forget to bring fresh water for drinking!

Advanced Water Play - Experienced swimmers can do the doggie paddle or float on their back, but advanced beach-goers know the fun of Lake Erie is enhanced with various watercraft rentals. Zoom around on a jet ski, paddle along the shoreline in a kayak or standup paddle board (some paddle boards even hold a whole group!), let the wind in your sails with a sunfish sailboat, or take a power boat out for a day on the lake. Jet ski rentals are offered at Cedar Point (North Coast Parasail) and South Bass Island State Park. Jet skis can also be rented from Bayview Watercraft Rentals and taken out to the sand bars in Sandusky Bay or customers are allowed to enjoy their private beach. Kayaks and paddle boards can be rented at Lakeside Beach, Cedar Point, Kelleys Island State Park, Nickle Plate Beach, and South Bass Island State Park. Extra-large paddle boards are offered at South Bass Island State Park and Nickle Plate. Sunfish sailboats are offered at Lakeside Beach and power boats can be rented at South Bass Island State Park or Cedar Point. Enjoy a bird's eye view of the beach with a parasail from North Coast Parasail at Cedar Point.

An annual **Fort Steuben Summer Concert Series** has drawn hundreds of music lovers to the Berkman Amphitheater in Fort Steuben Park each summer for the past 18 years. Every Thursday evening from May 30 to August 1, there are free concerts in a variety of genres, from Appalachian country to the Big Band Sound. Overlooking the Ohio River, concert goers bring picnic baskets or

purchase hot dogs or ice cream from local food vendors. The popularity of the concert series has inspired neighboring towns to create their own programs so there are musical performances nearby almost any day of the week.

More music can be enjoyed at the monthly **First Friday on Fourth** when Steubenville's main downtown street is closed to traffic and pedestrians can wander among the various artisan booths, try a local craft beer, taste some fresh baked goods, and listen to live entertainment. Interactive art projects, dance performances, and kids' activities add to the fun at each month's special event which will begin May 3 with a Street Music Fest theme.

History is celebrated at **Ohio Valley Frontier Days**, the first weekend in June, at Historic Fort Steuben. Visitors can march with Baron von Steuben, toss a tomahawk with Frontier Day, dip candles or watch the blacksmith with period music playing in the background. Other performers will present traditional early American instruments and music.

Ethnic celebrations are part of the fabric of life in Steubenville. The **Holy Trinity Greek Fest** is a highlight of the summer with the wonderful smells and flavors of traditional Greek dishes. 

# Stark Area Regional Transit Authority Introduces Micro-Transit Service

The Stark Area Regional Transit Authority (SARTA), which has won numerous national awards and secured millions of dollars in state and federal grants for its innovative zero emission programs and development and deployment of cutting-edge technology, is now preparing to introduce a new micro-transit service, a groundbreaking pilot project that will, when fully implemented, revolutionize public transit in Stark County.

The new service will be available in a limited area of southwest Stark County sometime soon. Like the popular ride-hailing services Uber and Lyft, the micro-transit will enable people to request on-demand, curb-to-curb rides on their mobile phone, tablet, or computer using a free app developed by Via, the world's leading provider of digital infrastructure for public transportation. Additional details about the pilot project, including how to download and use the micro-transit app, fares, exact service area, and hours of operation are nearly finalized and will be released to the media and posted on SARTA's social media platforms soon.

SARTA CEO Kirt Conrad said the micro-transit launch marks the beginning of SARTA's long-planned evolution from a mass transit agency to a Mobility as a Service (MaaS) system. "The differences between the two models are significant, game changing, and explain why MaaS is viewed as the future of public transportation," he said.

"Traditional transit systems offer separate fixed route and prescheduled on-demand service," Conrad explained. "Fixed routes are exactly that–fixed. They travel to set locations at set times. Ondemand services, like our ProLine, require users to pre-register and schedule trips in advance. While this service model meets basic needs, its inherent rigidity makes it challenging for us to provide the coverage, flexibility, and convenience existing and potential new riders desire." "Adopting the MaaS model and implementing the micro-transit will enable us to overcome those challenges by merging our various mobility services into a single, user-friendly platform that will give riders unprecedented control over their public transit experience," Conrad said. "We believe that by enabling users to summon the ride they need when they need it, whether they are traveling early in the morning, late at night, or to

a place our fixed routes don't reach now, this micro-transit will generate increased ridership by making SARTA a more attractive transportation option than ever before."

While the service is similar to Lyft and Uber, Conrad noted that the micro-transit will offer two distinct advantages over private companies: cost and safety. "Our fee per ride will be much more affordable and, because safety is, as always, one of our primary concerns, all vehicles in the micro-transit service will meet the requirements set in place by SARTA and operated by drivers who meet the same requirements and expectations that our SARTA drivers do on a daily basis," he said.

"Everyone at SARTA is excited about the opportunities our new service will create and confident that the micro-transit will make SARTA *the* ride more and more people use to travel to thousands of destinations in Stark County and beyond."



# Explore the Natural Wonders OF THE ALLEGHEN NATIONAL FORES

The Allegheny National Forest (ANF) is an extensive area of natural beauty in Pennsylvania. It offers a unique blend of recreational activities, breathtaking landscapes, and a rich history. This captivating area has been a favorite among visitors for generations.

A highlight of the ANF is the Kinzua Sky Walk. Selected as "One of the World's Top 10 Most Beautiful Skywalks and Viewpoints in the World" by the Culture Trip, UK, this engineering marvel offers breathtaking views of the Kinzua Gorge. Constructed on the historic Kinzua Viaduct remnants, the skywalk extends 624 feet into the gorge.

Visitors can walk among the treetops and experience a unique perspective of the forest's beauty. Additionally, the glass-bottomed observation deck at the end of the skywalk provides a thrilling view of the forest floor 301 feet below. This makes it a must-visit destination for those seeking adventure and aweinspiring scenery.

The Allegheny River has been declared the 2024 Pennsylvania River of the Year. This accolade, awarded by the Pittsburgh-based group Three Rivers Waterkeeper, underscores the river's significance. It highlights the river's importance in the local community and its role in the state's natural beauty.

Mountain bikers can also enjoy the trails at Jakes Rocks, which has been recognized as the Pennsylvania 2024 Trail of the Year by the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. With a variety of routes from the gentler loops of the Tuttletown and Coal Knob trails to the thrilling one-way Blacksnake gravity trail, Jakes Rocks offers something for riders of all skill levels.

Parking is available at several locations, including the Jakes Rocks Trailhead and Kinzua Point Information Center. They connect to the Dewdrop Campground for those looking for a convenient overnight stay.

On June 22, beginning at 11 am, join a dozen of Ohio's family wineries for a festival of Ohio wines at Put-in-Bay, on the grounds adjacent to the historic Heineman Winery. But the Wine Festival will be just one part of a wonderful day on Ohio's best known lake destination: The Key West of the Midwest.

Board one of the Miller Boat Line vessels at the end of Route 53, sit on the upper deck, take in the sunshine and enjoy the lake's fresh air. As you approach the festival's field, stop by the Historical Society display to discover some real treasures and support their efforts to preserve the stories of the island's founders and its "Wine Island" roots.

Then, for a couple of hours, join the festivities at the Island Wine Festival to sip and sample with winemakers from across the state who will be pouring red, white, blush, dry, sweet and fruit wines for you to enjoy.

Sip and sample until you find a favorite. You will surely discover wines you will love. Then relax with a glass or two while sitting under the shade of trees that have provided a relaxing place for visitors for decades. And, plan to take a couple of bottles home to re-create that "island experience" this summer when you return to sipping on your own back deck. Local vendors and food purveyors will offer some easy to enjoy light, lunchtime fare, while island artisans will showcase many of their talents.

When the event closes, hop on your golf cart (or perhaps walk again) toward the vibrant downtown area of Put-in-Bay. Explore the shops, ride to the top of Perry's monument and take in a panoramic view of the entire Bass Island complex in Lake Erie's beautiful western basin.

Before sunset, head back to the ferry dock and watch as the sun drops to the horizon and contributes

> colors of pink and blue to the skyline as you return to the mainland and find your car, with take home bottles in hand to remember a wonderful day in this magical place.
